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### MAKING VACCINATIONS HAPPEN WHILE FIGHTING COVID-19

PITTSBURGH (October 22, 2020) –

While families are consumed with keeping themselves safe during this pandemic, much preventive care is going unaddressed. Understanding that some school districts are beginning to reopen, and others will eventually, it is more important than ever to help families prepare for what's next.
